Analysis of Student Satisfaction Survey-2019-20

The IQAC of Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda College (Autonomous) has collected primary data by using a pre-tested questionnaire encompassing identification and opinion on teaching learning process from the sample students studying in all the courses offered in the college during 2019-20. The sample size was 20 percent of the students studying in the first year, second year and third year Under Graduate courses; first and second year Post Graduate courses; M.Phil and Ph.D programmes selected based on random sampling method. The collected data has been analysed by using statistical tools and the results are presented in the following tables.

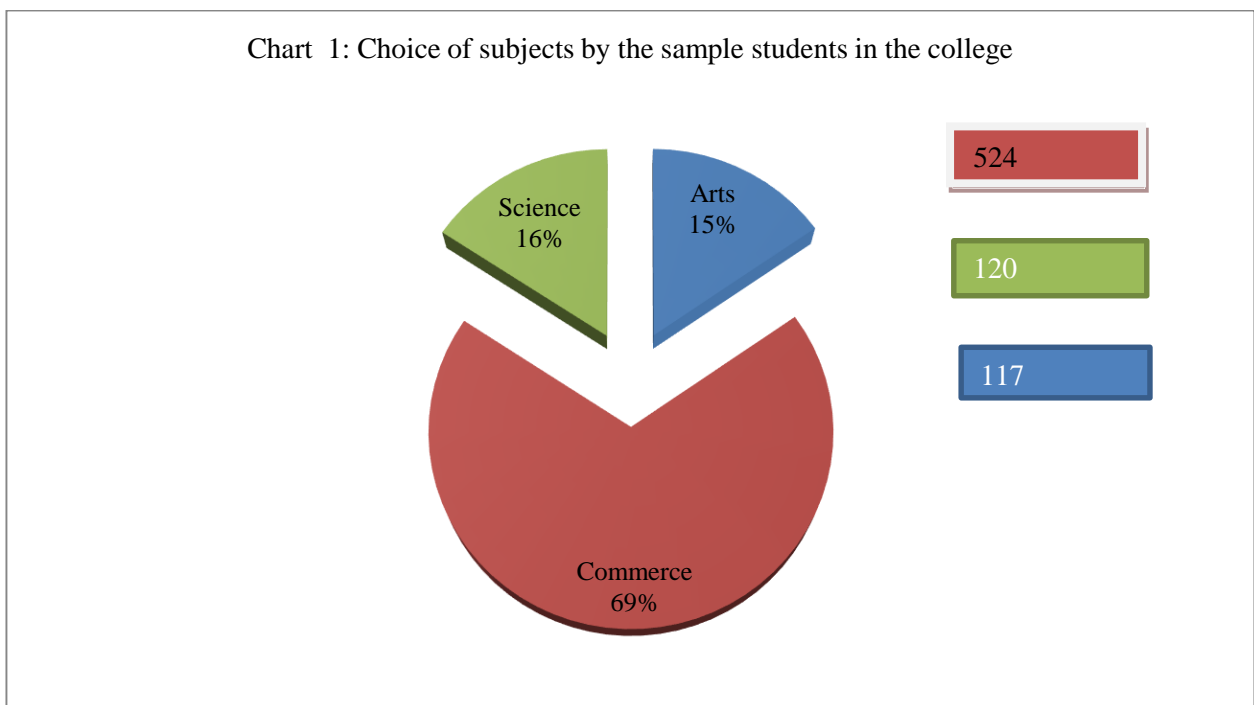

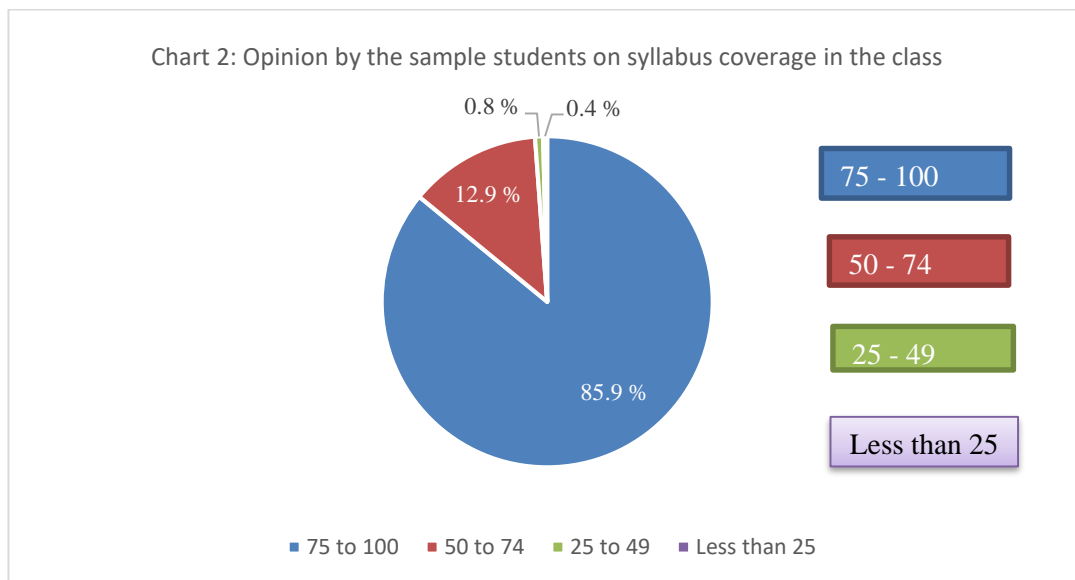

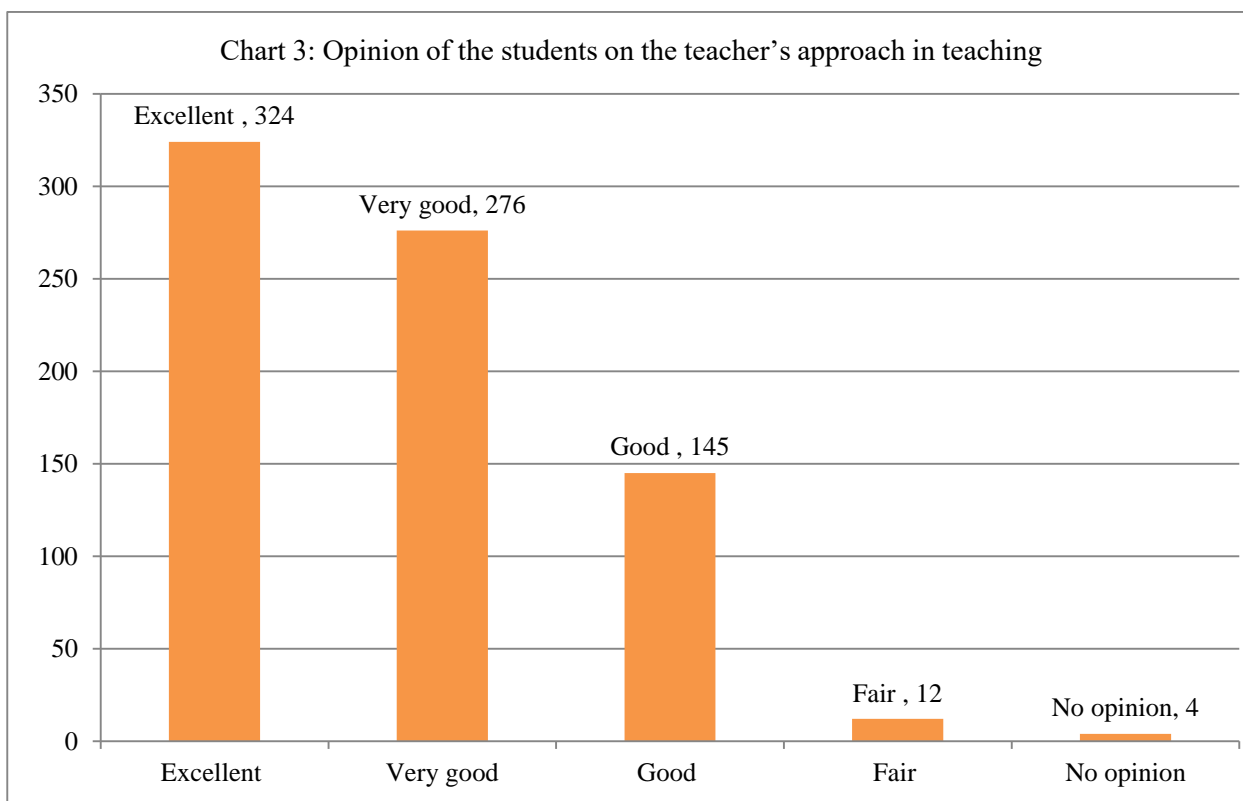

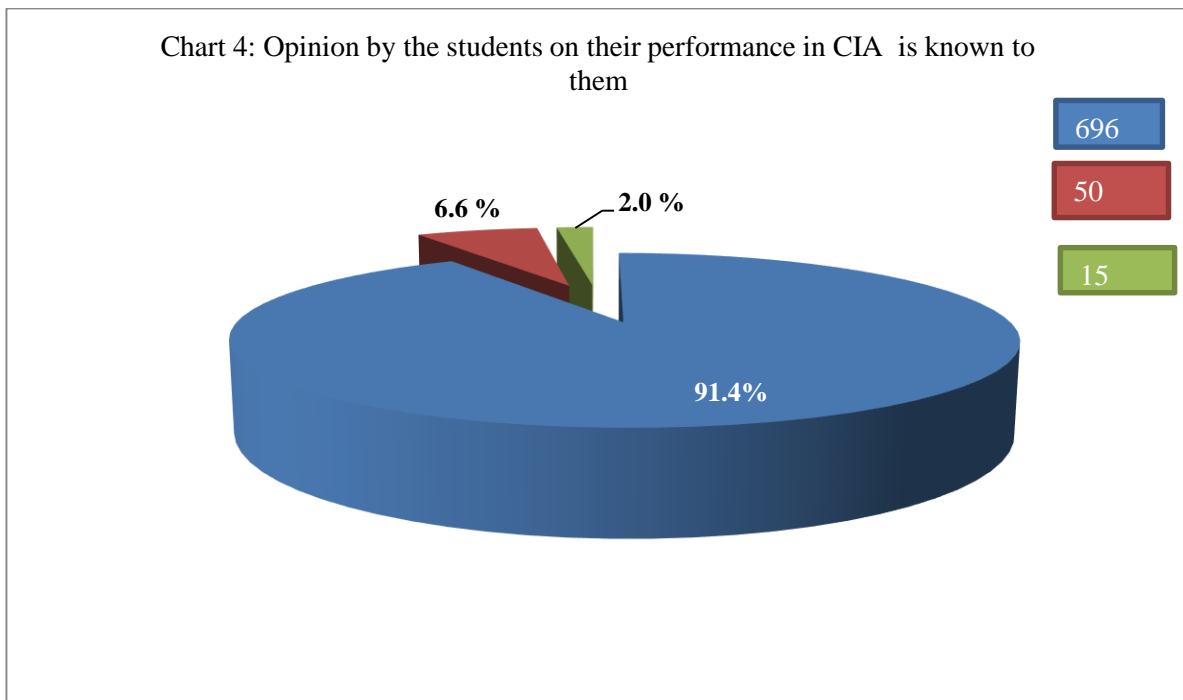

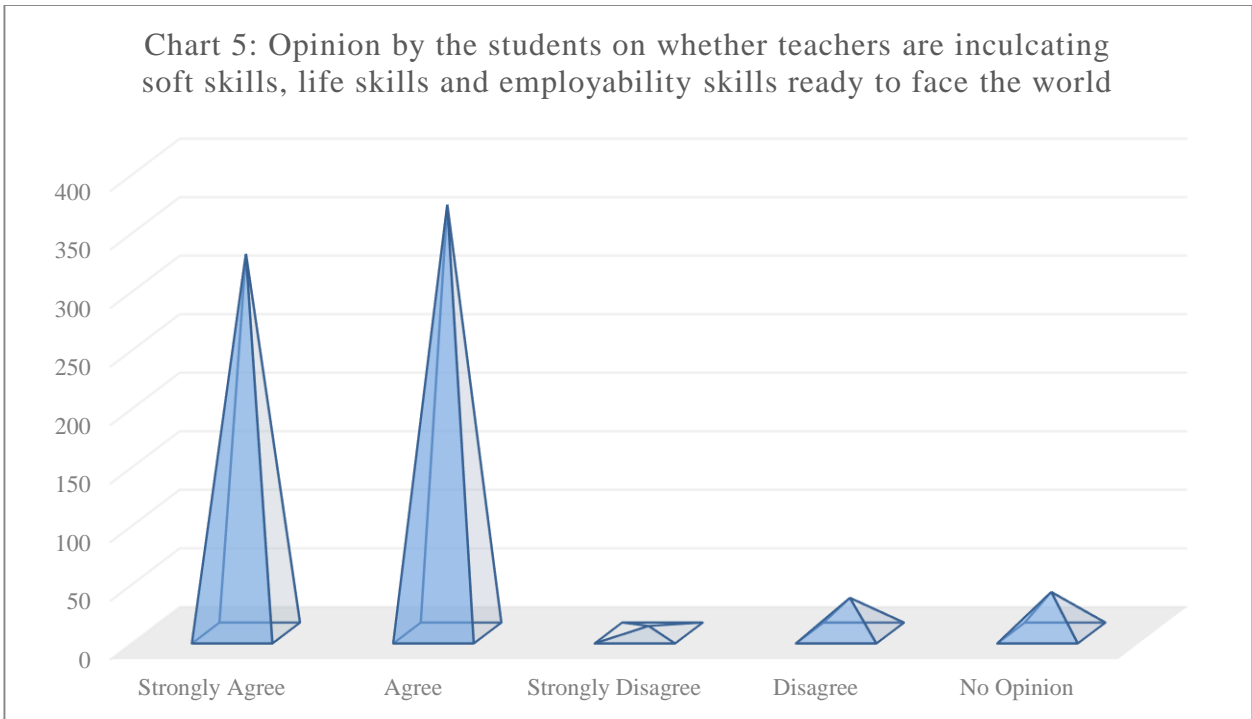

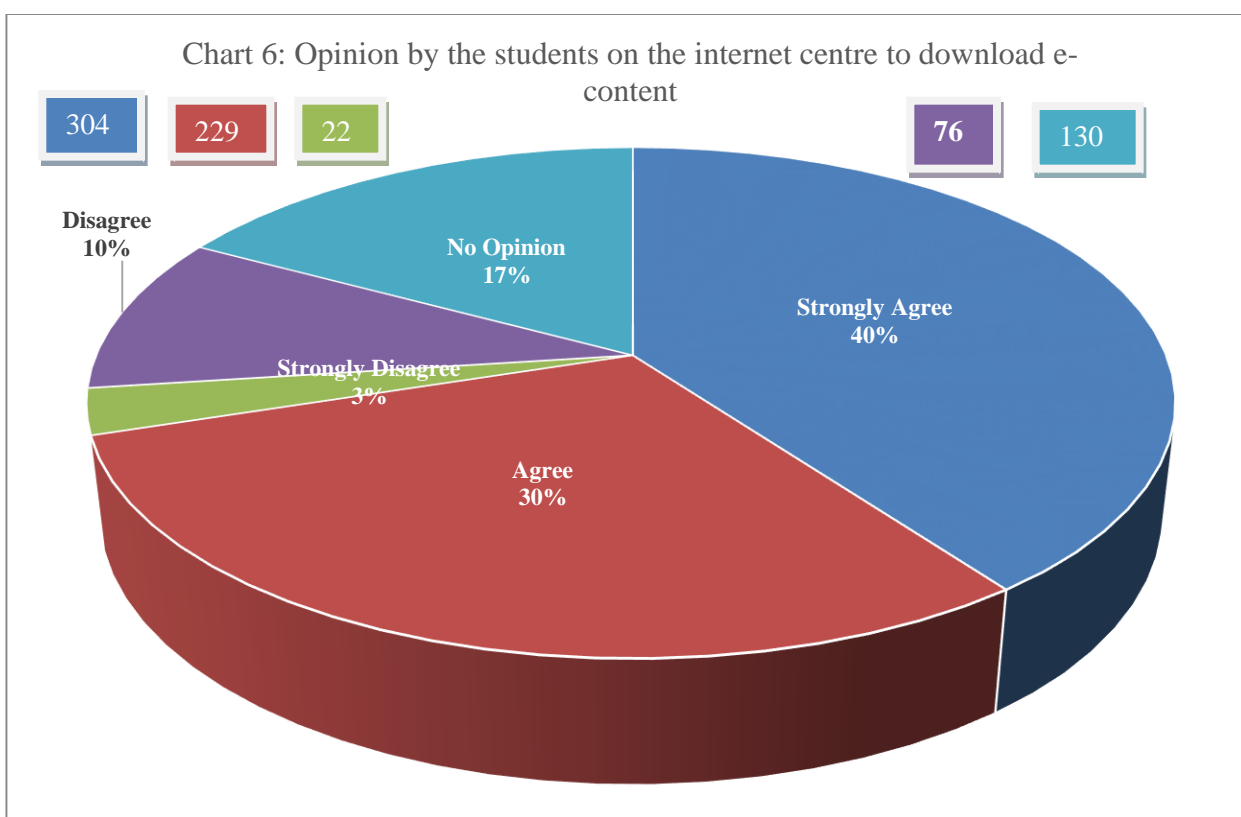

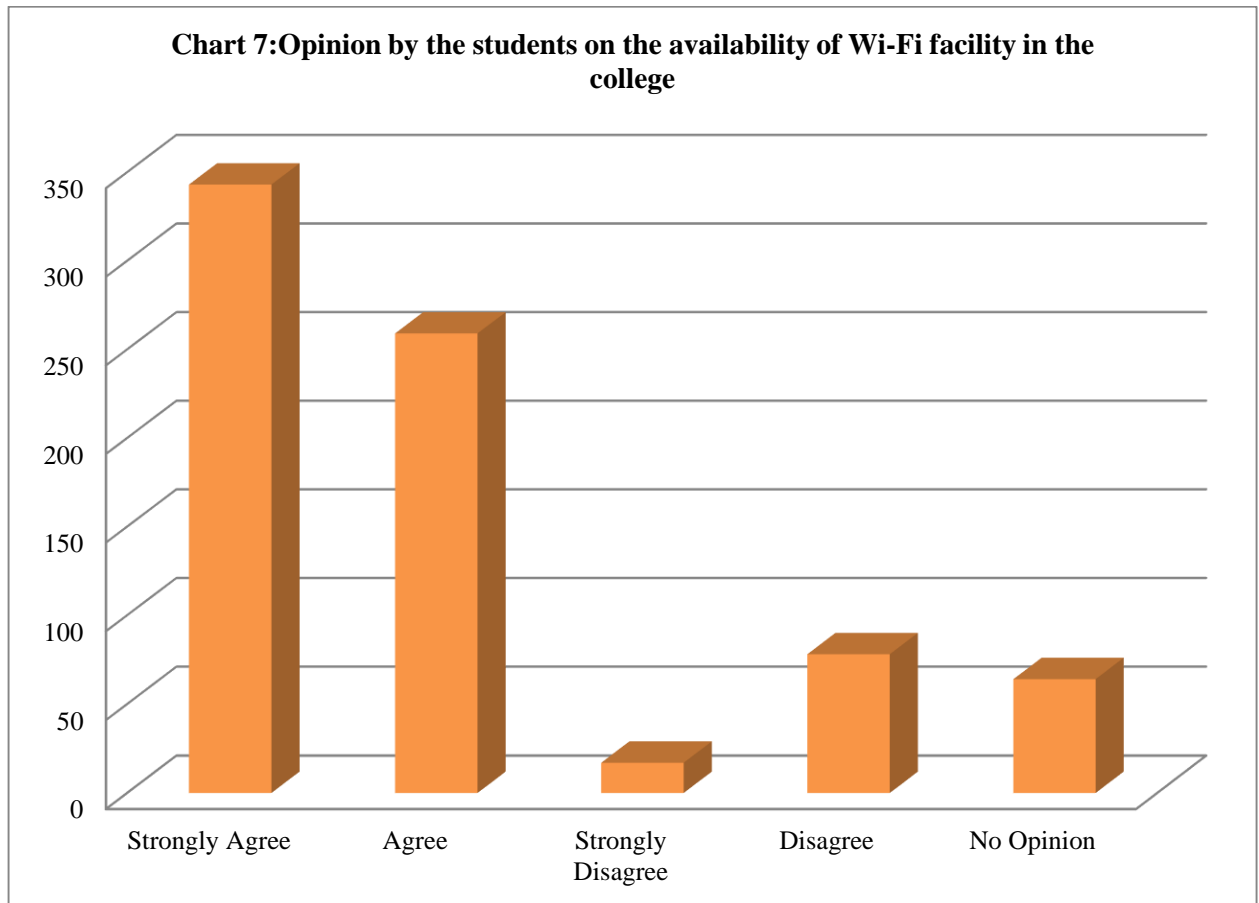

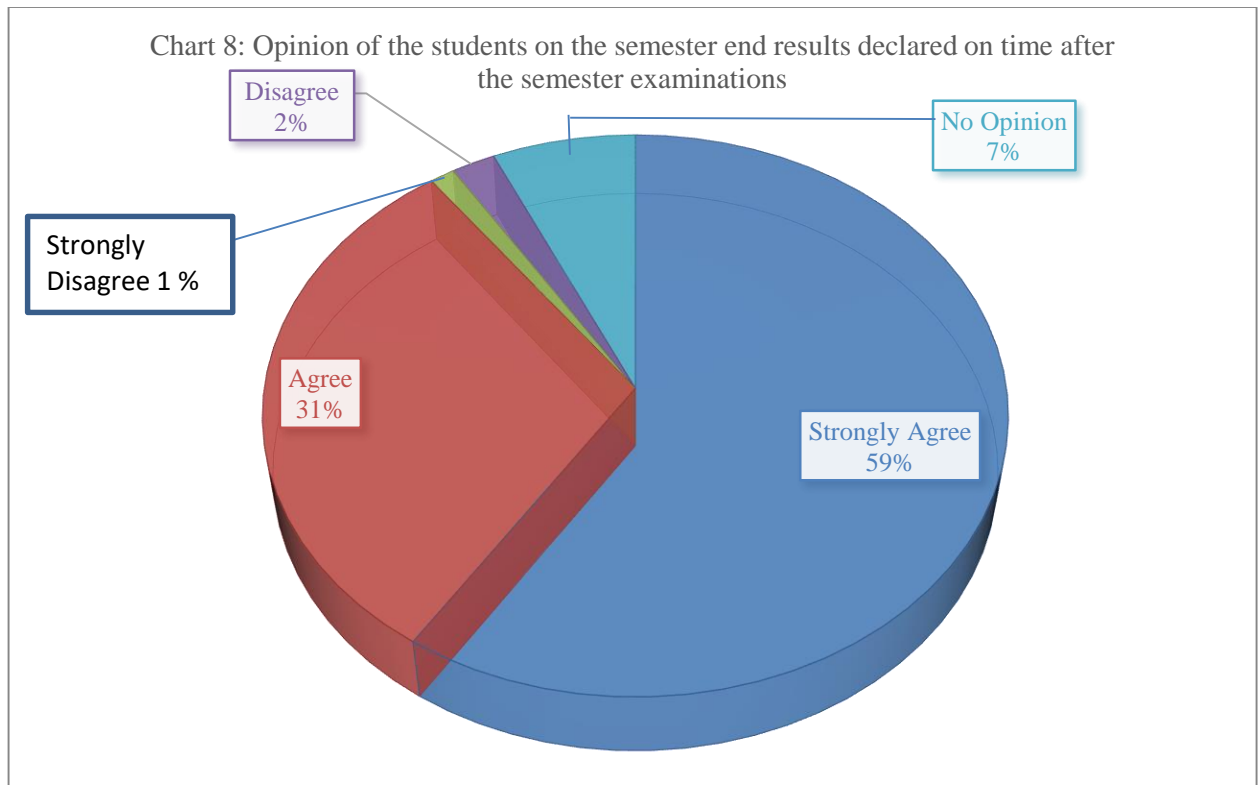

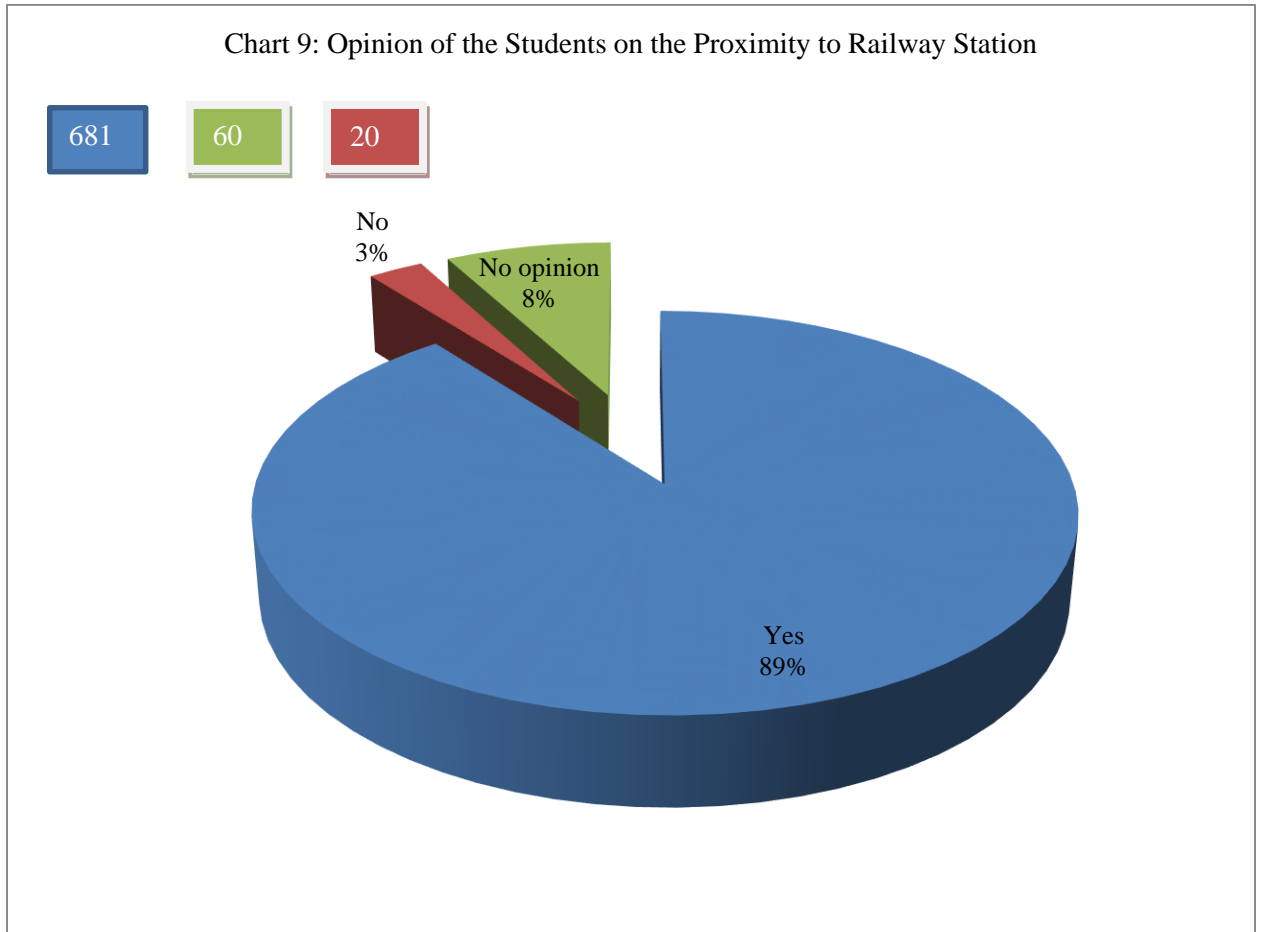

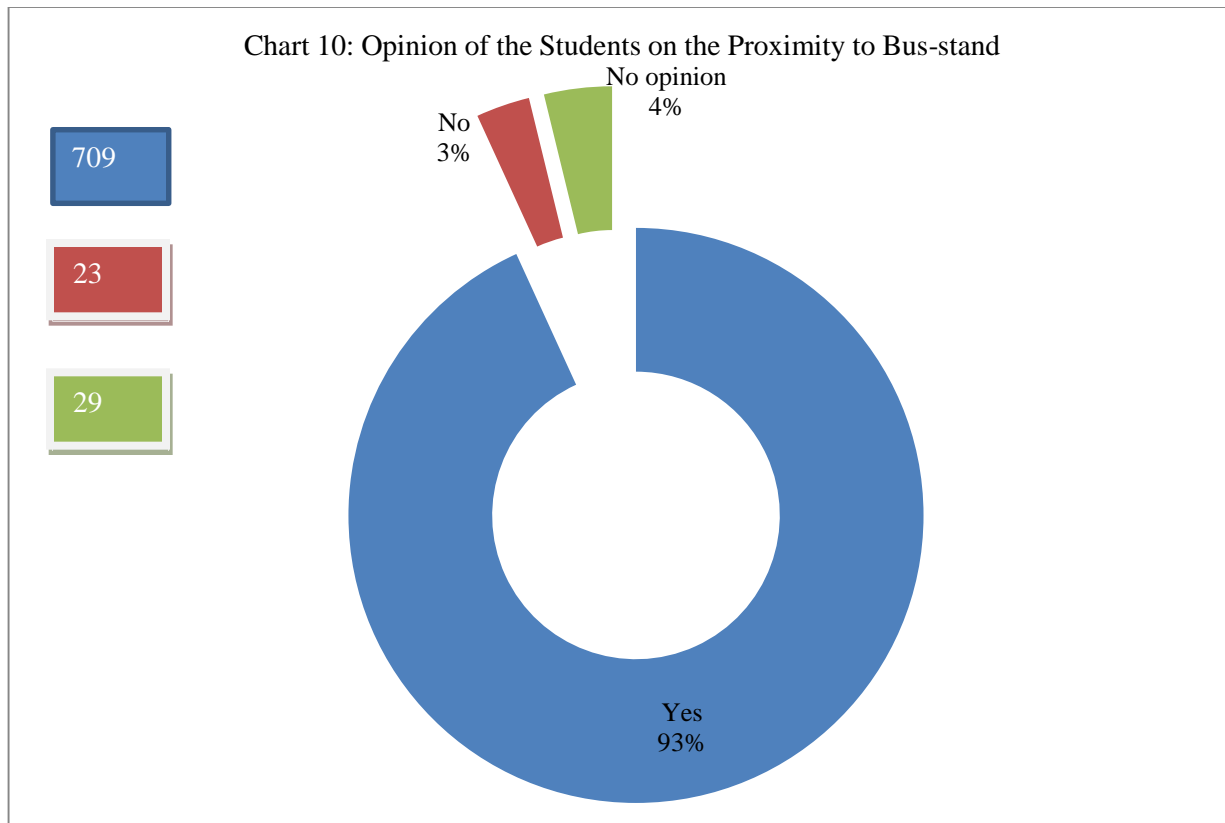

Chart 11: Opinion of the Students on the Clean and Eco-Friendly Campus

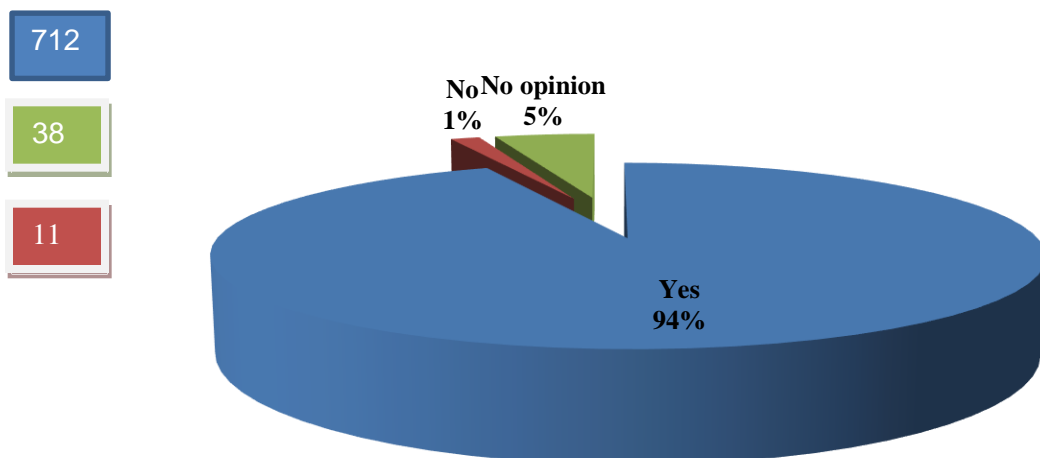

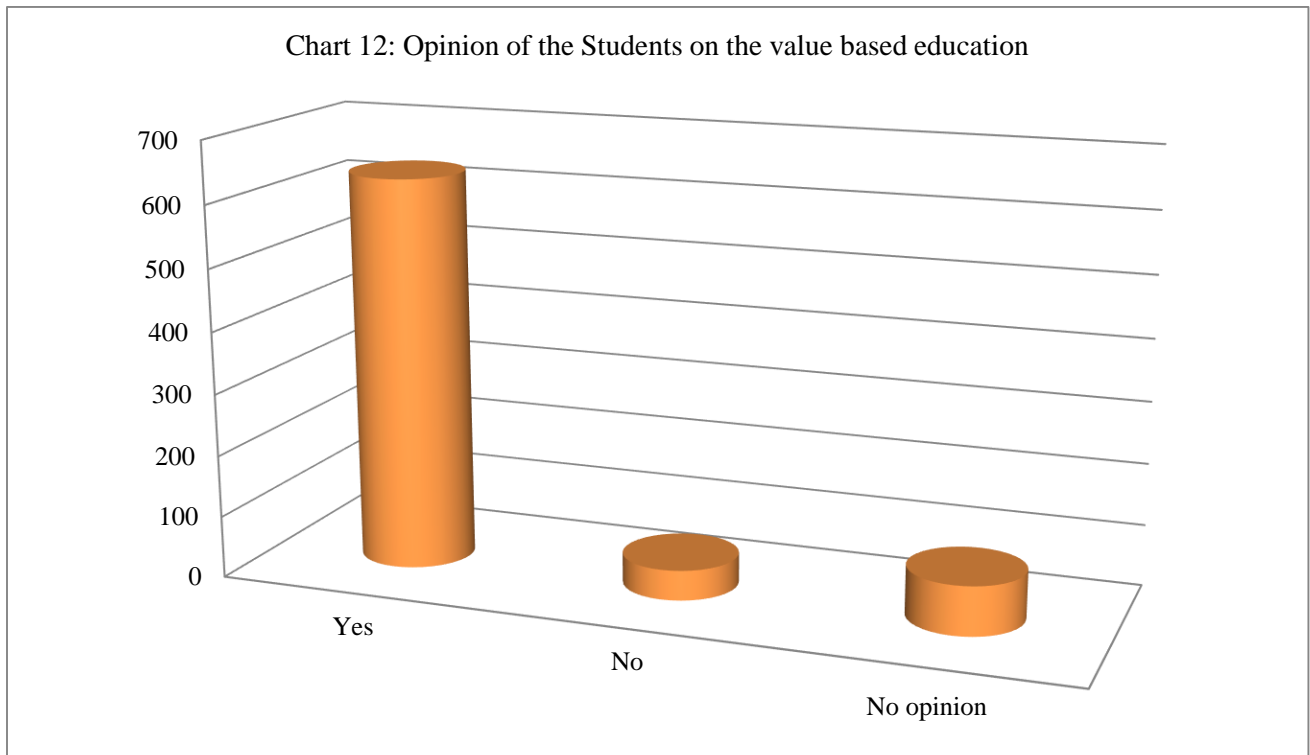


Table 37: Opinion of the Students about greenery and eco-friendliness of the campus

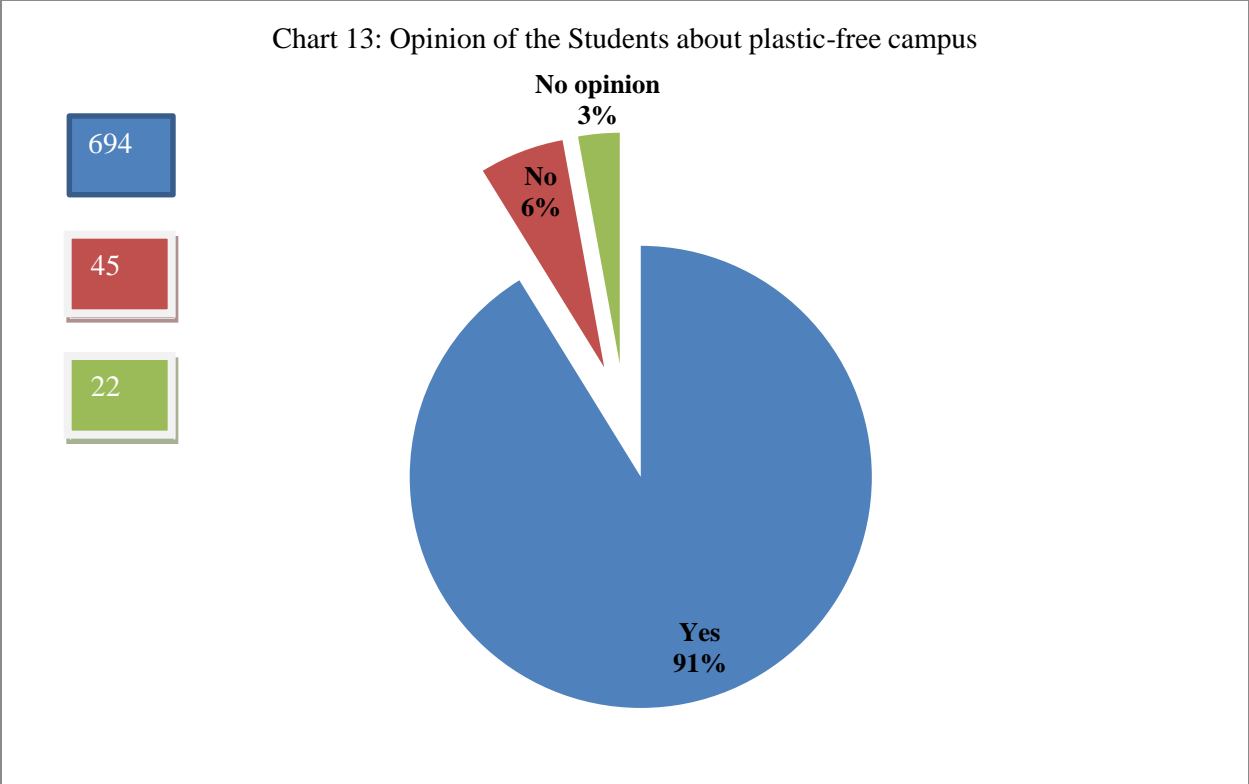

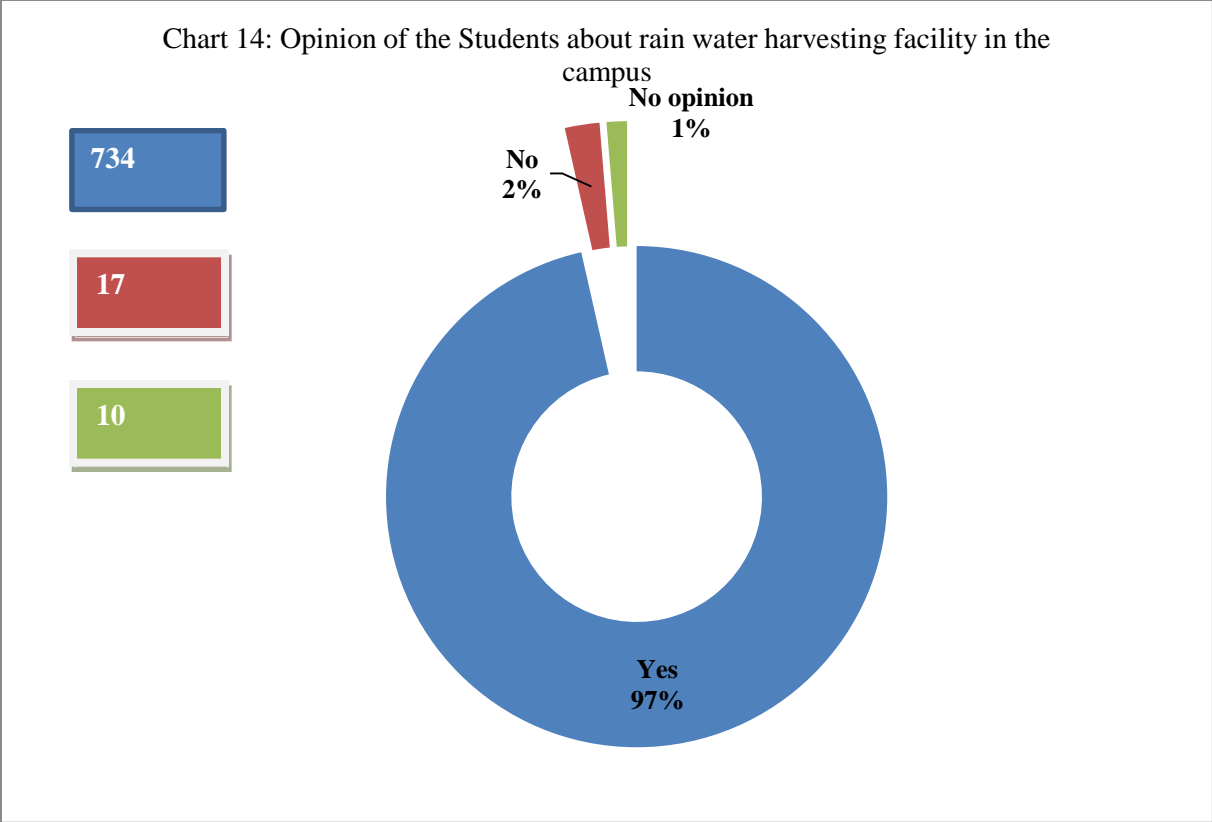
